

One day, a proud lion was asleep in the wood, his head resting on his paws. A timid mouse came along. The mouse didn't see the lion and ran across the lion's nose.


The lion woke up from his nap. He was cross with the mouse. "You woke me up!" he roared and laid his paw on the mouse, ready to gobble her up.


Volume and Capacity Millilitres:

How many of each container is needed to fill a 1 litre jug? Remember: 1 litre = 1000 mL




Today we are looking to compare different capacities.

In the past 2 days we have investigated 1 litre L and smaller millilitre ML units. Today we will be completing some worksheets that allows us to compare smaller units.


