### **School Open Times and Morning Routines**

The school opens at 8.30am – please do not send your children before this time as there is no supervision. All students are expected to enter the main quadrangle in the morning between 8.30am and 9.00am. Parents may come in with their children and sit in the main quad as well if they wish but as your children get older I would encourage you to drop your children at the gate and let them build their self-confidence by walking to the quad themselves. They are then expected to line up when the music begins. As soon as the bell goes parents must leave the main quad area. It is a requirement that as soon as children enter the school grounds they must go straight to the teacher supervised area – in this case the main quadrangle (whether they are with their parent or not). The area near the Kinder rooms remains out of bounds in the mornings for students because there is no teacher supervising this area. Hi all,



**Event name: Hands On Workshop: Rockets**
