Our Morning Routine

Our morning routine changed a little last year to accommodate COVID protocols and we have continued this routine. Children walk into school by themselves, however if parents need to walk their children into the school they must stop at the BLUE line on the pathways and then children walk by themselves to either the main quad area (between 8.30am and 8.50am) or to their classroom (from 8.50am to 9.00am). If children are late to school (after 9.00am) they will need to go to the front office for a late note. All late arrivals need to be explained.

At 8.45am all children in the main quad area sit down for a few calming minutes. They then walk to their classrooms in grade groups as directed. We have found this more settled start to have great benefits in the classroom. Students are actually in their class ready to begin work, and they have had several Care, Excellence, Innovation, Opportunity in a positive, dynamic environment

minutes to calm down and ready themselves for the day. We are also noticing great gains in student independence as they have to say goodbye to parents at the blue line and walk the rest of the way into school by themselves.

Kinder students:

Our lovely Kinder students may follow the same protocol as above now. They are used to being in the main quad area and if they arrive at school before 8.50am, they now need to walk to the main quad area to play with their friends. Kinders will walk to their classroom at 8.50am, along with the rest of the students.

Kinders who arrive after 8.50am may walk straight to their classrooms – thank you parents for stopping at the blue line and letting the children walk by themselves into class.

Department Easing of Restrictions

The NSW Dept has eased some of the current COVID restrictions, including allowing more parents on site for more activities.

- This means we will be able to change our plans for the Easter Hat Parade – and actually invite parents to join us on the front grass for this event! Wonderful news!
- Due to the short timeframe, we will still run our Semester 1 Merit Assembly as planned but we look forward to a more "normal" Semester 2 Merit Assembly with our parents on site.
- We will continue our morning routine (as explained above) and will make some slight changes to the afternoon routines.
- In the afternoons, parents may wait on the front grass area as usual, or at the back of the school for their children. Parents may also choose to wait in the undercover seating areas near the Kinder rooms or on the hard-court area for their children.
- We will continue to have the main quad area and the classroom areas unavailable for parents waiting to pick up children.

• No sign on is necessary for drop off or pick up of children. All other visits on the school site will require your sign on at the front office and your use of the NSW Service QR Code.

Wherever you choose to wait, please ensure you comply with social distancing guidelines.

Gates Locked at 9.15...reopened at 2.45pm. The only gate to remain closed but unlocked will be the pedestrian gate next to the Car Park gates.

STAFF CAR PARK

Our staff car parks are for Department of Education staff only. The only exceptions are for those people with a current disability permit. This can either be the RMS official permit or our Clairgate permit which is issued under special circumstances. The car park at the back of the school is for some staff overflow and for the Department of Education Transport staff to pick up and drop off students in Wingaru. Some people who are not entitled to do so, are using the car parks as a drop off or pick up point. This is becoming both dangerous and frustrating for those who need to use our car parks.

A note from the Deputy

Welcome back, everyone

At Clairgate, we will continue to extend the use of the self-regulation tool strategies known as the Zones of Regulation. The concept is explained below and complements the Kindness On Purpose whole school approach we have been using for the last four years. It also works in partnership with the classbased Bounce Back program and moves towards individual self-regulation.

All these wellbeing programs support the "The Wellbeing Framework for Schools" of the school and the NSW Department of Education and Communities that... students have responsibility to be active learners who exercise self-regulation appropriate to their age and level of understanding.

Each coloured zone has associated tools/strategies which support children to be able to self-regulate and manage their emotions.

It should be emphasised that throughout an average day, it is normal to feel a mixture of all emotions. We often move between the Zones numerous times over the course of a day and experience a wide range of feelings.

Green Zone	I am feeling: Happy, focused, ready to learn and calm	
Blue Zone	I am feeling: Sad, tired, bored, nervous or sick	
Yellow Zone	I am feeling: Frustrated, silly, a little out of control, worried or excited	
Red Zone	I am feeling: Angry, upset, out of control, wanting to yell or hit or am refusing to work	

How can I support my child at home?

To support our work in school on developing emotional regulation, we would encourage you to discuss this at home too. Here are some ideas of questions you might like to use at home: Which zone are you in?

Which zone are you in?

- What tools/strategies could you use to get back into the green zone?
- Tell me about a time you were in the red zone and how you dealt with it.
- How would you support someone who is in the red/blue/yellow zone?


Library
