A note from the Deputy

Attendance at School Matters Making Every Minute Count!

At Clairgate Public School we have a real commitment to supporting and ensuring students attend school. **Our school day begins at 9:00am and finishes at 3.00pm.** The information below highlights some important elements around attendance. The Department of Education monitors individual student attendance closely and would really like to see all students work hard to increase their individual attendance percentage.

Higher student attendance at school is associated, on average, with higher student achievement.

Why is regular attendance at school important? Regular school attendance will mean that your child has a better chance in life.

- they learn better
- they make friends
- they are happier
- they have a brighter future.

Why must I send my child to school?

Under NSW law, you must make sure your child of school age is enrolled and attends school all day, every school day unless they have an acceptable reason. The DoE Attendance Policy states, "Consistent attendance at school is critical to achieving positive educational outcomes and keeping students engaged in their learning. Parents/guardians have a legal obligation to ensure a child is enrolled in and attending school or is registered for home education".

Avoid keeping your child away from school for:

 birthdays, shopping, visiting family and friends, if they sleep in, looking after other children, haircuts, etc

Routine medical or other health appointments are encouraged to be made either before or after school or during the school holidays.

What should I do if our family is going on a holiday in school time?

You are encouraged not to schedule holidays during school time. If your family holiday is during school time, let the school know in advance and talk about what arrangements can be made for your child.

Do I need to let the school know if my child has been away from school?

Yes, you must let the school know the reason why your child has been absent. If possible, advise the school beforehand.
