



































































### **Attendance Matters**

When your child is marked as absent you will receive an SMS. Please respond to this SMS with the reason for your child's absence.


Alternatively, you can send in a paper note the next day your child returns explaining why your child was absent.

**Number Talks** 

Number Talks is an educational approach that involves short, daily discussions aimed at developing students' mathematical understanding and mental flexibility. During number talks, students and teachers engage in conversations about mathematical problems, with a particular focus on strategies for solving them mentally. At Clairgate, our children are involved in number talks daily.

The primary goal of number talks is to help students become more flexible thinkers in mathematics. By encouraging students to share and discuss their thought processes, teachers can foster a deep understanding of mathematical concepts and promote the development of various problem-solving strategies. Number talks typically involve mental calculations, allowing students to explore different approaches to arrive at the correct answer.

When focusing on additive strategies (addition and subtraction), number talks can be especially effective.

I'm hearing you ask, 'What can I do at home to support this?' Fantastic question! You can do the same with your child/ren at home. Ask them addition or subtraction questions and ask them how they come up with their answer. See if they can solve the question any other way. This encourages the flexible thinking.

If you are wondering if this is worthwhile, here are some of our children explaining the benefits of number talks. Enjoy!


