

## **Attendance Matters**



Compulsory school attendance

We are committed to working with you to offer support and remove any barriers that may be preventing your child from regularly attending school.

Please remember that the NSW Education Act requires that all student absences must be explained within 7 days of the first day of them being away from school. Please contact us promptly whenever your child is absent and let us know the reason for them being

away. This allows us to provide the right support and make sure your child's absences are recorded correctly.

In the event your child has repeated or ongoing unexplained absences, we will continue to try to contact you about each absence to provide appropriate support for you and your family.

We know that for our students every day of school matters.

Missing a day here or there may not seem like much, but absences add up and can negatively impact your child's learning and wellbeing. When your child misses one day a week, that's 40 days of school and 8 weeks of learning in one year. Over an entire school journey this adds up to 2.5 years of lost learning.

Re: Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD)

Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about supports provided to students with disability. These relate to legislative requirements under the *Disability Discrimination Act 1992* and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the *NCCD guidelines* (2019).

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The NCCD provides state and federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students with disability.

the support of students with disability. The NCCD will have no direct lingest on your child and your child will not be involved in any testing process. The school will provide data to the Australian Government in such a way that no individual student will be able to be identified – the privacy and confidentiality of all students is ensured. All information is protected by privacy laws that regulate the collection, storage and disclosure of personal information. ## News from 2R with Mrs Rogers

2R have been working hard in Term 3.

During InitiaLit lessons we have learning about digraphs, trigraphs, prefixes and suffixes. We have been looking carefully at sounds in words and recognising rules that help us with our spelling. We have been focusing on reading fluently using punctuation in a text to help us to use expression as well as making personal, text and world connections to help us to better understand what we have read in a text.

In Mathematics, 2R have been looking at the attributes of numbers and using effective strategies when counting. We have investigated the place value of numbers, how to form and use groups of ten when counting, accurately sequencing numbers as well as making a smart guess when estimating the total of given amounts.

We are very excited to perform at Clairgate on Parade at the end of Term 3 and will be working hard to practise our fantastic dance moves!
